Anti-social behaviour
• Report from resident regarding a group of young people drinking on school field (Shooting Field) responded and moved group out of the school grounds. • Patrol of Memorial gardens, came across 17 young adult's drinking alcohol and playing loud music, checked ID, ensured the litter was cleared up and the group moved out of the gardens. • Call from resident in Shooting Field relating to young children climbing a tree to look into the resident's garden and attempt also to intimidate her, we responded and issued words of advice & updated Saxon Wield as they had also received complaints from residents at Dingemans. There haven't been any further incidents at present. • Call from resident regarding a near miss involving a Black VW Polo near Middle Mead at approx. 08:30 on 24th June. Witnesses say the vehicle mounted the curb and hit a bin before driving at speed towards Shooting Field. The Resident reported this into the Police, at 20:30 we had a conversation with a different resident who witnessed the incident and was able to give the vehicle registration, fed this information into the Police with crime reference number. • Report relating to litter being left in the outside gym (Fletchers Croft). Increased Patrols.

• Report of dog fouling in the Memorial Paying Field. Increased patrols.
Elderly / vulnerable
• Delivered reading club session at Dingemans in absence of Nicky Fuller (Age UK) • Attended Older Persons Forum, received referral from Debbie Wood (Community Connector) regarding isolated individual feeling very lonely and struggling to get out due to disability. We visited the resident and discussed the possibility of her attending one of our regular trips which we run for our Thursday Dingemans club. • Engaged with vulnerable person whilst out on foot patrol near Rublees Allotments, she was very disorientated so we gave reassurance, advice and accompanied her home. We have since had more engagement with the individual and she has agreed for us to carry out welfare visits.
Community

- For national Drug Awareness Week we attended the grammar school and handed out drugs information leaflets, we also engaged with many young people and educated them on the dangers of certain drugs.
- We attended a meeting with George Spiller (contact at the co-op) relating to an inter-generation community event which we are happy to assist with. A further meeting has been set to lay out the details of the event itself.
- We were asked to attend a Careers Morning at the lower school and talk to several different classes about who the wardens are and what we do. The event was very successful and very well received.
