Session Highlights / what went well Attach pictures at the end of the report	Activites this half term included: • Poppy Making and why we have poppies • Bonfire Cakes and Quiz • Board Games Day • Colouring • Ball Games – Football, Group Games, Basketball, Dodgeball, Bull Dog • Dress Up • Drama and Dance • Christmas Crackers, Christmas Trees, Santa Hats, Christmas Bags, make your own Christmas Decorations, Wreath Making • Toasties • Chocolate Bananas • Singing • Bouncy Castle and Christmas Party This half term the young people have started to settle and staff have noticed a change of friendship groups and staff are also aware of ensuring that any issues that may of occurred at school are not continued into the session, if necessary we use a restorative justice approach where we individually talk to those involved and then get them together to discuss the issue and learn how it has impacted on all concerned, this approach is working well and has meant that tensions are dealt with and the group dynamics remain settled. The group have all taking part in the planning and have engaged well in the activity organised. One of the young people bring in their dress up clothes from their home and the group have fun making up role plays and dances to show the group and staff. The young people have also enjoyed using the hall to practice their gym and cheerleading from school, this is monitored by staff and lifting is not allowed due to the risks involved. They have also made the most of being able to run around in the hall taking part in a variety of sports and games. The group are very creative and enjoy cooking and arts and crafts and we will continue to offer this during each session. The young people need to learn listening skills, to encourage this staff spend the last 20 minutes running a group game with everyone where they need to listen to each other and learn more about each other in a fun and friendly way. Alan from the parish council has popped in a couple of times this half term and the young people enjoy talking to him about what they get up to, also what they would like to do with the building, this includes wanting to decorate it by painting it white and doing three murals upstairs around the buildings use. Jo has emailed David Barling from WSCC in November 2019 who said he may have some money he can use to fund this decoration. Jo has chased this again in Jan 2020 as not heard back.
