Important Note Re COVID-19 Outbreak.

From Monday 23rd Mike had to self-isolate for 14 days. This period of isolation would finish on April 5th. During this time Mike & Paul both worked from home completing hundreds of calls for isolated people across the district and graded their needs as set out by HDC. (See below) Many of these calls were on behalf of Community Link, the Health & Well-being teams, but primarily call lists were created via people referring themselves or others into HDC who had little or no support from family, friends or carers. Once graded – RED, AMBER or GREEN, these would be dealt with accordingly.

RED – Urgent assistance needed – Food/Medicine – Sent details to Warden Supervisor, Darren Worsfold.

Amber – Ok for supplies but need support going forward. (Details to Local Volunteer HUB)

Green – Has support at current time as well as provisions, always advised to call back in if their situation changes.

It goes without saying that none of the above would be possible without the Volunteer HUBs, we would like to acknowledge the incredible and selfless work that they have been undertaking, not only in Steyning, Bramber & Upper Beeding but across Horsham District.
