ASB/crime/criminal damage

Steyning –

Issues with large groups of youths gathering on the memorial playground. Some groups have been playing too near to residents back gardens and in one instance a residents guttering was damaged. We have been patrolling on a daily basis and advising accordingly. We have also had issues with the incorrect usage of barbeques that in one instance damaged a section of grass in the orchard area. The recent Lockdown and consequential lifting of restrictions has meant large numbers of residents have been using the Playing field for socialising and recreation. On the whole people have been considerate to one another and have observed guidance. There has been however heated exchanges between residents and groups of young people. Some residents have complained that these groups were abusive to them when they complained that they were playing football too near to their back gardens and on one occasion using a disposable B.B.Q. We have also had reports of large groups using the Rifle Range and littering the area. We have also had reports of drunken males on the M.P.F. in the early hours of the morning and on one occasion in the early evening.

We have had a number reports of Speeding Cars late at night in Newham Lane and Charlton Street.

We have had a report of a homeless man drunken and disorderly on the M.P.F early morning by the groundsman. Police were called and attended. Homeless man refused to give his name and we updated police on his details.

Ejected two groups of youths from the open air gym in Fletchers Croft.

We have had a report from a resident regarding overflowing bins and rubbish left in bags outside their back gates on the M.P.F.I consequently emptied bins and cleared rubbish as it was creating a health hazard.

Bramber –

Potential issues with customers of Bramber Castle public house buying off sales and drinking from plastic glasses in the Car Park and Bus Stop and outside pavement. Daily patrols carried out to monitor potential A.S.B. Police and Licensing aware.

Bramber Castle grounds and Car Park very busy. Regular patrols carried out. Some littering.

Graffiti on Bridge. Response from H.D.C. and West Sussex Highways.

Upper Beeding –

No issues with social distancing on Recreation Grounds.

Report of suspicious vehicle in St Peters Church Car Park. Daily patrols carried out.

Ejected two groups from Playground, including one group with adults and children.

Numerous reports via Truleigh Hill Whats App Groups regarding influx of visitors not abiding by Country Code, trespassing, not keeping to public footpaths other inconsiderate behaviours. P.C.S.O Erica Baxter assisting with this. There is now clearer signage in place.
