ASB/crime/criminal damage

Steyning –

January saw a spate of break ins including Steyning football club where £400 cash was stolen and two break ins on separate occasions in the same week to Martins newsagents in the High Street. On both occasions the front window of Martins was smashed and cigarettes were stolen. Approximately £3500 were stolen overall. We liaised with local businesses and gathered lots of local Intel which enabled us to aid Police investigations.

Reported assault on homeless person in Steyning High Street bus shelter. Victim was taken to hospital. We were given information relating to the perpetrator which we passed onto the Police.

Visited leisure centre after report of a group of young people breaking into the sports hall and sleeping in a cupboard full of crash mats. It was also reported they were smoking & drinking in there. The leisure centre have since secured the area which they were gaining access. A name was given to us and we have given a group known to us a verbal warning.

A resident contacted us about a man standing on the roof of Charlcroft shouting abuse at passers-by. This happened at about 8am, the individual is known to us so we passed details onto the Police.

We had cause to move group of youth on from grounds of SME (Mill Road). Reports received from a resident that young people occasionally sit by the wheelie bins and smoke cannabis. We moved the same group from the grounds of Steyning Grammar whilst on joint patrol with two local PCSO's.

We had cause to move on a group (different to the above) away from the bus shelter in Steyning as they were consuming alcohol.

Witnessed suspect and probable drug deal outside a property in Steyning. Vehicle details taken and passed onto the Police.

Call from resident making us aware of a small group of young adults smoking cannabis regularly behind the coffee shop horse box in Bramber Car Park.

Window of pharmacy smashed early hours of the 17th.

Reports of window being penetrated twice by bullets/air rifle pellets. Arranged reassurance visit and increased patrols in area.

Issued raised by Police relating to off road bikes at Truleigh Hill riding on the Site of special scientific interest. We will be involved in a multi-agency meeting next month to discuss ways of tackling the issue.
