ASB/crime/criminal damage

Steyning –

We continued to receive reports from residents and the school relating to a group of young people who have continued to breach COVID-19 Regulations and engage in anti-social behaviour. On a number of occasions we have needed to intervene and move the group from the Steyning Centre and the Fletchers Croft area, mainly due to the breach of COVID regulations and smoking of cannabis. On one occasion we had to call the Police as we were subjected to a significant amount of verbal abuse and one member of the group rode his bike alongside us and was hitting our vehicle. We have now linked up with PCSO Foster who, in addition to PCSO Bicknell, is also covering Steyning, Bramber & Upper Beeding. He has also had several interactions with the group and has arranged additional directed patrol activity from passing police units. We also have direct contact with the Youth Officer based at Horsham Police Station, who has advised us to call him upon encountering the group and he will try to attend.

We have also had multiple other groups breaking COVID restrictions in the Fletchers Croft car park of an evening including a group who decided to strike up a football match. For the most part the groups we've challenged have been compliant.

Bramber –

We had cause to break up two groups of young people gathering at Bramber Castle breaking COVID-19 restrictions.

There were concerns raised regarding people drinking in the bus shelter in the street. We have increased our patrols of the area in response to this and haven't witnessed any associated ASB. The Castle public house have been visited by the licensing team who are satisfied there are no breaches of current regulations in relation to off-licence sales.

Upper Beeding –

A group of 15 young people gathering in the MUGA breaking COVID-19 restrictions and drinking underage had alcohol confiscated. We have increased our high visibility patrols of the area.

We intervened with a group of 4 young adults (all over 18) gathering in the bandstand drinking and breaking COVID restrictions.

Parking/vehicles

Steining –

Two vehicles at the very end of Shooting Field towards Tanyard Lane were causing an obstruction, and Yellow Warning Notices were issued.

We were on hand to control traffic at school kick out time as the busses couldn't get out of Fletchers Croft due to cars being parked near the junction and on both sides of the road. A Yellow Warning Notice was issued and a PCSO contacted the owner of the vehicle causing the obstruction.

Bramber-

Following reports of bikes speeding through the street we have increased out patrols and static observations of the Street in Bramber.

Upper Beeding-

Concerns were raised about a lady living in a horsebox moving onto an area of land adjacent to the High Trees Car Park. We visited a few times and engaged with her, she was very reasonable and has now moved to another area.

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

Steining –

A mattress and other household waste was left in the lay by along the bypass which has since been removed.

Upper Beeding

Bramber

Household waste was located at Bramber Castle which has since been removed.

We located a number of bin bags, in Maudlyn Lane which we removed ourselves.

We came across a vehicle in Bramber Castle car park full of household waste, we suspected the driver may have been looking to tip, we stayed in the area and they drove off shortly after.
