ASB/crime/criminal damage

Steyning –

We issued banning letters on behalf of the Parish Council to 6 individuals known to have been causing ASB problems at the Steyning Centre and the High Street Bus Shelter. This was done on our and the Police's recommendation as further action needs to be taken against consistent ASB Issues which includes Drug Use, Underage Drinking, Criminal Damage and Public Order Issues. One member of this group of young people has been issued with a CPW (Community Protection Warning) which has conditions set by the Police. This came after the arrest of two young people from this group, who engaged in a physical confrontation with the Police after allegedly throwing a glass bottle into the Police Station Car Park. We are monitoring this individual's behaviour when on patrol and reporting breaches of the CPW directly into the Police.

We received information relating to a large end of year party where many young people attended at the flint barn on Steyning Downland Scheme land. We were fortunate to have Police presence in addition to ourselves. Generally there were minor ASB issues and our main concern was for the safety of the young people going to and from the event under the influence of alcohol. Some alcohol was confiscated by the Police from under age young people prior to the event.

Bramber –

We engaged and checked the credentials of a Cold Caller in Bramber after receiving a call relating to high pressure sales tactics from a person matching his description. Words of advice given with no call for further action due to ID being valid.

We continued patrols in Bramber Castle grounds due to reports of young people using nitrous oxide canisters.

Upper Beeding –

We had cause to intervene with a group of young people outside the MUGA who were playing loud music and consuming alcohol. They were all under age but we were unable to confiscate alcohol as they only had a few cans of beer which they had already drunk. We ensured they turned their music down and cleared away litter which they complied with.

We had a call from a resident relating to two young people cycling around using a catapult. We attended and patrolled the area and spoke to two young people who matched the description. They denied they were the people responsible and left the area. We didn't have any further calls or issues.
