Recycling Bin provision

Briefing Note

We have discussed this item before, and a number of issues were raised. The original paper follows below this update. I would like us to agree or not to the purchase of the bin at £449, plus bin liners at £36, plus installation at £150 – Total £635.

The questions raised as follows. Updates in blue

- Where is the bin proposed to be placed?

This would be decided by recommendation from Bus Shelter beautification working party and agreement back at Community Committee

- Is it to replace a bin that is already in place?

This would be decided by recommendation from Bus Shelter beautification working party and agreement back at Community Committee

- Should it wait until the car park is re- furnished?

This would be decided by recommendation from Bus Shelter beautification working party and agreement back at Community Committee

- What size is the proposed bin?

I believe 2 x 100 litre Bins

- Who would be emptying the bin, how many times a week and at whose cost?

HDC would empty the recycling bin side free of charge. The refuse side would cost ££2.65,per empty if done by HDC, however we could ask our bin emptying contractor to do this each day as part of the existing contract

- Concerned that the bin will cause a fly tipping issue.

Not certain why this would present an issue. There would be other bins available

- Who will pay for the bin and its installation?

Steining PC – see above

- It would need to be agreed to be removed if an issue of fly tipping did happen.

It could be removed at a minimum cost (approx. £30) by our own maintenance contractor if needs be

Dear Parish Council

I am a member of the Greening Steyning Green Consumer group and we are looking into making recycling options more readily available within Steyning, Bramber and Beeding. We have formed a partnership with Sussex Green Living to recycle the items that don't go in the blue bins and have organised collection at the monthly farmers market.

In addition to this, I have been in touch with Horsham DC regarding public bins and whether they would collect separated rubbish if we were to position these types of bins within our town and village centres. They are happy to do this and have similar arrangements with other villages and towns in the area. They advised that the procurement, authorisation and positioning of the bins would need to be discussed with the Parish council.

Please can you advise who would be the best person to discuss this with?

We have done some research and found these bins which you can customise to your own needs.

Ideally, we would love to start with a bin in the high street car park in Steyning and possibly near NISA in Upper Beeding. Also, ideally, in the Bramber village car park. Obviously, the more we can have the better but we are aware of cost implications. We have also formed strong relationships with the schools to collect recycling and could look to have separated bins positioned at each of our schools as a long term plan.
