Young people of the District invited to shape future leisure and outdoor spaces

Horsham District Council is inviting people to share their thoughts about outdoor space and leisure provision for teenagers in a new survey launching today.

There will also be a series of focus groups with local schools and youth forums. The survey was created by a special task group of councillors, set up to understand whether outdoor spaces in the District meet the needs of teenage girls and boys equally.



The results will help the Council to review current policies to try and ensure shortfalls identified are addressed in future design and planning.

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Horsham residents to vote on how new People's Budget is spent

The People's Budget of £100,000 was approved by the Council in June 2024 and will focus on activities and initiatives that support children and young people under 25.

As a first step, local charities and community organisations are being asked to put forward proposals that will benefit the under 25s via an application for funding.

The organisations will be able to apply for grants of either £20k, £10k or £5k for their activities.

These funds will then be distributed in line with a public vote, ensuring residents can decide how funds are used for priorities that matter most to them.



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
