



CCTV Consultation



Steypning Parish Council is consulting on the introduction of a new community-led CCTV system to help improve safety in key public areas of the town.

- The proposed locations for the initial cameras are Fletcher's Croft, the Memorial Playing Fields and parts of the High Street. There would also be the option to use small mobile units in specific problem areas, such as fly-tipping hotspots.
- The aim of the scheme is to help deter anti-social behaviour, support police investigations, protect public facilities, increase safety and provide reassurance to residents and visitors.
- Cameras would only monitor public spaces such as pedestrian routes, car parks and access points, and would not be aimed at private homes. All footage would be handled lawfully and in line with data protection rules, with strict controls on who can view recordings.
- The system would be managed by trained council staff and neighbourhood wardens, working in partnership with Sussex Police where necessary. Independent oversight, a clear complaints process and regular transparency reporting would also be in place.
